Application Procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The application will be reviewed and processed by designated staff members at both the home and host institutions, not on an individual basis. • Graduate students will receive official admission only after being reviewed and approved by the department or laboratory in their chosen field of study.

<p>Qualifications</p>	<p><Undergraduate Student></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a minimum of 2.0 out of 4.5 cumulative GPA or 70 out of 100 points equivalent at the home institution • a proof of English or Korean Language Proficiency (minimum TOEIC 600 or TOEFL PBT 487 or CBT 163 or iBT 57 or TOPIK Level 2) <p>※ If a student does not meet the qualification requirements stated above, Section B in his/her recommendation letter must be filled out by the student's academic supervisor.</p> <p>※ Undergraduate Exchange students do not need to take any Korean language proficiency test before entering Inha University. However, they are encouraged to take Korean language courses at Inha.</p> <p><Graduate Student></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a minimum of 3.0 out of 4.5 cumulative GPA or 80 out of 100 points equivalent at the home institution • proof of English or Korean Language Proficiency(minimum TOEIC 700, CET(College English Test) level 4 or TOEFL iBT 80 or IELTS 5.5 or TOPIK above Level 3 * Department of Korean Studies, Department of Korean Language Education : TOPIK Level 5 or 6) <p>※ If a student doesn't have the qualification requirements stated above, Section B in his/her recommendation letter must be filled out by the student's academic supervisor. 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Visa Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Foreign students seeking study in Korea should have a student visa (D-2) which can be obtained at the nearest Korean Embassy or Consulate. When applying for a visa, students are required to submit a “Certificate of Admission” which will be officially issued by Inha University <input type="checkbox"/> Every foreigner, who wishes to stay in Korea more than 90 days, should be registered and issued an “Alien Registration Card” at the Korean Immigration Office. <p>See http://eng.inha.ac.kr/stulife/immigration_procedures.asp for details.</p>

Airport Pick-up	<p>Students can directly apply for airport pick-up service online at http://www.airhelp.co.kr/english/index.html</p> <p>The fee is about KRW 75,000 and this is subject to change without prior notice.</p>
Insurance	<p>All international students are expected to obtain insurance coverage. International students can purchase an insurance policy from any insurance company in Korea or in their home country, but their insurance policy should cover accident/illness of more than USD 10,000. International students may also purchase insurance after they arrive at Inha.</p>
Accommodations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exchange students will be guaranteed on-campus housing at their own expense. • Application for on-campus housing should be made when submitting the admission application materials and payment can be made in cash upon arrival. <input type="checkbox"/> Dormitory fees (Spring 2015): approx. KRW 1 million <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ※ 4 people, shared bathroom & shower room • One semester runs for 16 weeks, an additional KRW 500,000 is needed for each winter/summer break. • Dormitory fees are subject to change each semester. • Quad rooms (four beds) are the only type of dorm room available to exchange students. • Breakfast and supper, Monday through Friday, are included in the dormitory fees shown above. All lunches, weekend meals and meals during holidays are the responsibility of the exchange student.
